BROOKLYN, NY — BioBAT Art Space is thrilled to announce the opening of WATER STORIES, an innovative exhibition that invites audiences to immerse themselves in the historical legacies, poetic essence, and ecological significance of water. Curated by Elena Soterakis, the exhibition runs from June 8, 2024 to May 3, 2025 at the Brooklyn Army Terminal in Sunset Park.

As Climate Change and increased urban flooding from storm events draw our attention to the coastline, WATER STORIES takes a powerful step towards focusing the viewer's attention on the watery world we can't see. This curation takes you into the other-worldly visuals of underwater ecosystems and feels like a private tour of fascinating aquatic neighborhoods that lie just beyond the shorelines of our city. The artworks invite visitors to dance with algae, take a murky cinematic dive into the Gowanus Canal, listen to music composed by bacteria gathered from the harbor, and take a virtual reality walk along vulnerable Staten Island coastlines.

WATER STORIES includes work by NYC artists Nathan Kensinger and Scope Collective that includes Dr. Elizabeth Hénaff from NYU, as well as featuring international collaborations with Japanese-Austrian artist and researcher Yoko Shimizu and Tokyo University. The exhibition includes a year-long series of water-themed public events and STEAM Educational Programs. These events aim to foster meaningful dialogue around the stories and experiences of water, deepen our connection to local waterfronts, cultivate reverence for the natural world, and strengthen bonds with global waterfront communities.

WATER STORIES results from a groundbreaking Art-Science collaboration between New York's Bio Art Gallery, BioBAT Art Space, the Interstate Environmental Commission (IEC), and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Housed in the cavernous and historic halls of the Brooklyn Army Terminal with its iconic NY harbor views, WATER STORIES invites audiences to immerse themselves in multi-sensory installations and interactive artworks, encouraging a reflective journey that underscores the critical importance of water in all our lives.



BIOBAT ART SPACE

Established in 2019, this artist-run non-profit gallery is uniquely embedded within BioBAT Inc., a biotech research center at the historic Brooklyn Army Terminal in New York City. 
